ACTS 18:23-19:7 PAUL'S THIRD JOURNEY: THE FOCUS, EPHESUS

Luke only summarizes the end of the second missionary journey of Paul and the beginning of the third. At the end of the second, Paul leaves Priscilla and Aquila and, most likely, Timothy in Ephesus (18:18-21). The beginning of the third journey is covered in one sentence despite the fact that its initiation covered ____ miles with stops at numerous churches (18:23). The emphasis of the third journey is Paul's stay in Ephesus which lasted three years.

18:24-28 Apollos to Ephesus (Precedes Paul)

In the next two paragraphs, Luke focuses on some men who had been baptized by John the Baptist. The first, Apollos, who had heard enough from John to be saved, then baptized; hence when hearing more of God's way did not have to be re-baptized. The second, twelve who did not hear enough from John to be saved; hence had to be re-baptized after they believed.

v. 24, 25	Apollos to Ephesus: his background
	- a Jew, born in (Egypt), the literary/educational rival of Athens. The
	LXX version of the Old Testament originated here.
	- an "eloquent" man; <i>logios</i> , meaning "articulate," "polished," "learned"
	 one "mighty" (dunatos) in the Scriptures; not superficial
	 one "instructed in the way of the Lord;" not a neophyte
	– one who taught diligently, <u>accurately</u> (ακριβως / akribos) what he knew of Jesus
	 one who knew only the baptism of John; he needed instruction here
v. 26	Apollos still needed instruction
	and provided it
	"They welcomed, warmly received him" (probably into their home)
	"They explained, expounded more accurately" the way of God.
	Note the play on the word "accurately" in vrs. 25 & 26.
	 Priscilla and Aquila worked at synagogal communication (like Paul).
	 Note that Apollos does not get re-baptized.
v. 27, 27	Apollos to Corinth
ŕ	- "Achaia" =; he ministers in I Cor. 1:12; 3:4-6.
	- "he helped them much which had believed." How? Verse 28 explains, Apollos reaffirmed what
	Paul had taught. He had a ministry of REAFFIRMATION. Maybe you do, too!
	19:1-12 Paul to Ephesus: Clarifies the Gospel to John's Disciples
v. 1	EPHESUS
	 greatest commercial center in Asia Minor at this time
	 terminus of several trade routes: harbor to Aegean Sea
	capital of the Roman province of : a "free" city
	 home of a very large Jewish population
	• site of the Temple of (Diana): wonder of ancient world
	 became a center of evangelism under Paul (and a great church)
