Five Key Words upon which the purpose of John Pivots

1.	Signs ($\sigma\eta\mu\epsilon\iota\alpha/\text{semeia}$) = selected miracles of Jesus fulfill John's stated purpose and help form the structure of this book. These are selected thoughtfully & purposefully.
2.	Christ = used times; the anointed King, the Messiah.
3.	Son of God = used times; God's eternal and unique (only one of His kind) Son, therefore, worthy of worship. Theme of this Gospel is that Jesus is the Messiah, the eternal Son.
	-to be the Son is to be with God, 5:18as the Son, Jesus receives in the same sense as God does, 9:35-38for claiming to be the Son, therefore Jesus was to,19:7.
4.	Believe = times; "settled trust," to rely upon."
