

## **5 KEY STATEMENTS OF CHRIST ON PRAYER**

We are looking at various aspects of prayer in the New Testament. In this session, we will examine five key statements of Christ to His disciples regarding prayer.

**1. John 14:13 A key purpose in prayer is that the Father might be \_\_\_\_\_ in the Son. Is this verse telling us our real need? To glorify God in Christ!**
